As a soloist, Clare debuted at Boston's Symphony Hall in Handel+Haydn Society's 2018 performance of Bach's Mass in B minor (Harry Christophers); she made her New York soloist debut alongside the St. Thomas Fifth Avenue Choir of Men and Boys in their 2018 performance of Handel's Messiah (Daniel Hyde).
